Shipping & Handling	Velvets are rolled and suspended into strong cardboard boxes, with roll sizes varying from 20-35 Metres. Boxes MUST always be kept horizontal at any step of loading, transit, unloading and storage. Please inspect packaging upon arrival for any damage to the carton before unpacking. After inspection if velvet is not re-rolled or stored in the exact way it was shipped, pressure marks can occur and are difficult to remove. Never apply tape to the backside of the velvet. Velvet furniture should be shipped in protective packaging like padded wrap / bubble wrap. A protective covering should be constructed for corners or exposed arms and legs.
Sewing & Upholstering	Before cutting, ensure that the pile is going the same direction on all rolls. It is important, if possible, to ease up on the tension of the thread on the sewing machine. A round or ball like feeder dog is also recommended. This will help prevent chalk-like stripes coming from the feeder dog. It is important not to hammer on the face of the velvet when attaching tack strips. A rubber mallet is best, especially if covered with some cloth or even cuttings of the velvet. The most economical way to upholster furniture is to railroad the velvet. All sectional sofas or chairs in a collection should be railroaded. Occasional chairs and dining chairs can be upholstered up the bolt for the best look and yield.
